

Churchtown and District Children's Whitsuntide Festival

Guidance for floats/tableaux

All floats should arrive on the field at the Memorial Hall by 12.30pm. Once there a representative should register with the treasurer stating how many children are involved with the float.

The procession will depart from the field at 1pm going down The Avenue to Churchtown. In Churchtown there is a short Church service at St Helen's Church and responsible adults will be required to unload children, take them into Church and then load them back onto the float. The procession then returns to the Memorial Hall field. A contribution of £50 will be made towards each float.

It is the responsibility of those entering floats to ensure that:

- Trailers are in good condition;
- Anyone riding on a float should be seated and/or have something to hold on to;
- There are sufficient adults with the float to be responsible for all the children (ideally each adult should be responsible for a named group of children);
- All children are collected from the float by a named adult;
- All children wear sunscreen where necessary;
- Those responsible for the float on the day are aware of any allergies and intolerances the children may have, and are able to deal appropriately with them.
- The vehicle and trailer participating in Churchtown and District Children's Whitsuntide Festival is fully insured for road use as is the driver for driving the vehicle.
